- 2. Eligibility: Non-Japanese nationals studying or researching the Japanese language
- 3. Entry deadline: December 31 (Friday) 2021

- Include your nationality, name, age, gender, name of your school/institution or occupation, and email address.
- An individual entry or a collective entry as a university and Japanese language schools will be accepted.
